INT. HOME - EVENING

## COCKROACH-MAN

The men who hate me are dogs, yet dogs do not possess the ability to misbehave. I was a man once but my body has become loathsome and impure. And I am CORRUPTED!

STAN LEE

Believe in yourself Cockroach-Man.

COCKROACH-MAN (cont.)

I am small. Both physically. But mentally too. Once I was potent, but now my potency has turned to ash in my mouth; and I am a burden to those who once relied upon my labors. Yet, in the past I was relied upon in the way that a farmer relies upon a donkey. Not as a man. But as a tool.

(pause)

Perhaps... it is better this way.

COCKROACH-MAN dies.

End of film.
